## from the Leaders

On Monday East Para Primary School joined with other Pre-Schools and Schools in the Montague Partnership for a Pupil Free Day on Collaborative Moderation.

In the morning we discussed the Australian Curriculum, in particular the Achievement Standards in Numeracy and the evidence (student work samples) which would clearly demonstrate a student's achievement of the concepts.

After morning tea the Primary teachers listened to a key note address whilst the Pre-school and Reception teachers met to talk about continuity of learning from pre-school to school.

After lunch all teachers shared portfolios of student work. The learning intention, success criteria and professional assessment of each piece of work was discussed and feedback sought and given.

The purpose of the Pupil Free Day was to develop greater consistency in the assessment of students' work within sites and across the Montague Partnership.

I am appreciative of the work our teachers did in preparation for the Pupil Free Day, their positive and active participation in the conversations and their constructive feedback about that day.

The Term 4 Pupil Free Day will be on Monday 27th November (Week 7). On that day staff at EPPS will be interrogating our student data, in particular the PAT Data (students are currently sitting PAT tests) and the NAPLAN data to inform our planning for 2018.

### **NAPLAN Data**

I am very pleased to further inform our community about our NAPLAN successes.

Well done to our Year 3s whose mean scores in Numeracy and Writing were above the DECD average, Year 5s whose mean scores in Numeracy, Writing and Grammar were equal to or above DECD average and Year 7s whose mean score in Spelling was above DECD average.


